The Secretary, Senate welcomed the members to the 43rd Meeting of Senate and having ensured a quorum, continued with the Senate proceedings.

The Chairperson welcomed the members including the external members, Prof. K. Ramamurthy, IIT Madras and Prof. Gurusurthy Neelakandan, IIT Kanpur for their participation in the 43rd Meeting of the Senate. In her opening remarks, the Chairperson briefed the Senate about the recent accomplishments of the Institute. The Chairperson

highlighted the remarkable increase in research publications, citations in Scopus and Web of Science, patents filed, published and awarded in 2018 over the previous years.

The Chairperson also emphasized the significant increase in the number of sponsored research projects by different funding agencies and revenue generation through consultancy projects in the financial year 2018-19. The Chairperson highlighted the recent seven-sponsored projects funded by MHRD under Scheme for Promotion of Academic and Research Collaborations (SPARC) scheme and congratulated the faculty members for their achievements.

The Chairperson cited the recent programme on “Leadership for Academicians Programme” organized by NIT, Tiruchirappalli, in collaboration with Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore (International Partner) and Indian Institute of Information Technology Sri City (IIITS) as the Organizing Partner. She highlighted that the NIT, Tiruchirappalli is the only NIT among 15 institutions selected by MHRD, Government of India to organize this programme under the scheme “National Initiative for Leadership Development in Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs)”, congratulating the programme coordinators Prof. K. Bakthavatsalam and Prof. R. Jeyapaul for their assistance rendered on organizing this event.

The Chairperson remarked the grand finale of Smart India Hackathon (SIH2019) software edition hosted by NIT, Tiruchirappalli and highlighted that our institute had been chosen by the Ministry of Human Resource Development as one of the centers to host this function.

The Chairperson added highlighting that NIT Tiruchirappalli had been ranked third among Centrally Funded Technical Institutions / Universities and the only NIT among the thirty-one NITs in the country to find a place in Swachh Campus Ranking among the awardees. She also cited about Margdarshan (Share and Mentor Institutions) scheme - an initiative by AICTE designed to implement the ‘Hub and Spoke’ system to which NIT, Tiruchirappalli is the only NIT that has been granted the status of ‘Mentor’.

The chairperson appreciated the notable student achievements during 2018 and elaborated on the future directions for NIT, Tiruchirappalli in line with the Strategic Plan 2019-24 with the mission of “Locally Relevant, Globally Competitive” and to be in the top 500 Institutions in the world with the help of stakeholders.

Following the welcome address by the Chairperson, Registrar started the deliberations on the agenda items.

Approval Items

3. Revision of Seat matrix with reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) as per the revised OM

MHRD has requested every Central Educational Institution to increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of study with prior approval of the appropriate authority (MHRD OM, F No: 12-4/2019-U1 dated 17th January 2019). Subsequently, the Institute has received the revised OM (F. No. 35 – 4/2019-TS.III dated 5th March 2019) from MHRD regarding the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) for admission in Central Educational Institutes. With regard to the NITs and IEST- Shibpur, the phrase ‘in each branch of study or faculty’ stands modified as ‘in UG, PG and PhD programmes’. Based on this OM, the revised seat matrix (programme-wise) with reservation for EWS has been prepared for all UG, PG and Ph. D. programmes.

The Senate discussed the matter at length and approved the revised seat matrix with reservation for EWS for all UG, PG and Ph.D. programmes as given in Annexure - A. The intake with EWS for all UG and Ph. D. programmes are given in Annexure - B. Also, the Senate approved the following:

- a) Increase in seats in all UG and Ph. D. programmes with EWS reservation from the academic year 2019-20.*

- b) *Redistribution of number of seats in DASA scheme among the UG programmes as per demand so that the number of seats under DASA is completely filled.*
- c) *Implementation of EWS for all PG programmes from 2020-21. However, for three PG programmes (M. Arch., MCA and MBA), it was decided to implement the EWS reservations from academic year 2019-20.*

Further, the Senate directed the PG expert committee to review the existing PG programmes that requires revision and re-orientation before the implementation of EWS. Besides, the proposed new PG programmes that have undergone the selection process during the IoE proposal can also be reviewed by PG expert committee with appropriate subject experts.

RESOLUTION 43/SENATE/2019/3 **RESOLVED THAT the revised seat matrix with reservation for EWS as per new OM for all UG, PG and Ph. D. programmes be approved with above mentioned observations.**

4. Curriculum and syllabi for the proposed new PG programme in Department of Mathematics

The Senate approved the request to start the new PG Programme in M.Sc. (Mathematics) from the academic year 2019-20 without any additional faculty, laboratory and other financial commitment from the institute with an initial intake of 25, inclusive of EWS reservation. However, the curriculum shall be restructured as per the guidelines for PG programmes (Science stream).

Further, the Senate noted the following:

- a) *The duration of the M.Sc. (Mathematics) programme will be two-years (4 semester) with minimum 65 credits as per PG regulations.*
- b) *Admission to M.Sc. (Mathematics) programme will be done through centralised counselling for M.Sc. admissions (CCMN) based on Joint Admission Test for M.Sc. (JAM) score in Mathematics.*

RESOLUTION 43/SENATE/2019/4 **RESOLVED THAT the proposal (curriculum and syllabi) to start new PG Programme in M.Sc. (Mathematics) from the academic year 2019-20 with an initial intake of 25, inclusive of EWS reservation be approved without any**

additional faculty, laboratory and other financial commitment from the institute. However, the curriculum shall be restructured as per the guidelines for PG programmes (Science stream).

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the admission to M.Sc. (Mathematics) programme will be done through centralised counselling for M.Sc. admissions (CCMN) based on Joint Admission Test for M.Sc. (JAM) score in Mathematics.

5. Modified seat matrix for M. Tech. (Energy Engineering)

The Senate approved the revised seat matrix for M. Tech. (Energy Engineering) as proposed in Table 1 from 2019-20 onwards. However, the Senate directed the Department to provide the reasons for not considering all branches of Engineering by proper mapping of the existing subjects or advised to include more subjects so that the other branches of Engineering shall be part of M. Tech. Energy Engineering.


